1.3 Proposed Solution: N-TEMS

The Nationwide Transit E-Manifest System (N-TEMS) is proposed as a decisive, system-level response to this national emergency.

N-TEMS for short, is a centrally governed, real-time, biometric-enabled, AI-powered national security infrastructure designed to digitally tag, track, and trace every legitimate and suspicious movement of passengers, cargo, and vehicles across Nigeria's road, rail, air, and maritime networks.

It replaces disjointed paper manifests and institutional silos with a single national movement intelligence backbone—a single source of truth—accessible in real time to authorised security and intelligence agencies. This system is not just a trade facilitation tool. It is a national security shield.

1.4 How It Works

By integrating real-time data capture, identity verification, AI-driven risk profiling, machine learning analytics, blockchain-secured data integrity, and seamless inter-agency intelligence sharing, N-TEMS delivers situational awareness, predictive insight, and pre-emptive strike capability—allowing threats to be identified, tracked, and neutralised before they materialise.

1.5 Strategic Alignment and Integration

N-TEMS directly operationalises the objectives of the National Security Strategy (NSS) 2019 and the Revised National Cybersecurity Policy and Strategy (NCPS) 2021, establishing a defensible digital perimeter around Nigeria's internal and cross-border movement ecosystem. It aligns with, and provides the digital backbone for, ongoing federal reforms including the National Land Transport Policy, the modernisation of the Nigerian Railway Corporation, and existing Nigeria Customs Service (NCS) electronic cargo manifest systems, expanding their proven success into a comprehensive, multimodal national security grid.

1.6 Core Intelligence Gap Addressed

At its core, N-TEMS answers some questions the Nigeria government currently cannot answer with certainty in real time:

- Who is moving?
- What is moving?
- From where?
- To where?
- Under whose authority and with what risk?

1.7 Strategic Imperative

At this critical juncture in Nigeria's national history—amid a declared security emergency and unprecedented security-sector investment—N-TEMS is not optional infrastructure. It is a foundational national security architecture. It is a force multiplier that transforms fragmented data into actionable intelligence, converts mobility into accountability, and restores state advantage over agile, networked adversaries.

Its urgent adoption and nationwide implementation will mark a decisive shift from reactive enforcement to predictive, intelligence-led national security governance—securing Nigeria's present and safeguarding its future.

The Security Problem And Its Consequences: Why Nigeria Needs N-TEMS Now

2.1 Nigeria's Current Threat Landscape (2025)

Nigeria's internal security environment has deteriorated into a complex, multi-vector crisis characterised by highly mobile criminal and insurgent networks exploiting weaknesses in the nation's transport and movement systems.

Official 2025 data (Q1-Q3) from the Office of the National Security Adviser (ONSA), Nigeria Police Force (NPF), Nigeria Customs Service (NCS), and Department of State Services (DSS) reveal the scale and operational patterns of this threat:

- **Banditry:** 1,847 recorded attacks concentrated in Zamfara, Katsina, Niger, and Kaduna States, frequently facilitated through unregistered motorcycles and falsified logistics movements.

- **Kidnapping for Ransom:** 3,219 cases nationwide, with major hotspots along the Abuja-Kaduna, Lagos-Ibadan, and Benin corridors, often executed using fake courier vans and hijacked commercial trucks.
- **Arms Smuggling:** 672 seizures at key border points including Seme, Idiroko, and Borno frontiers, with weapons concealed in food trucks and fuel tankers.
- **Human Trafficking:** 411 documented rescues in Ogun, Kano, and Cross River States, where victims were disguised as migrant workers or farm transporters.
- **Insurgency Logistics:** 98 IED-related arrests in Borno, Yobe, and Adamawa States, with supplies moved through commercial buses and vehicles falsely branded as NGOs.

These threats share a common enabler: the exploitation of Nigeria's transport systems as unmonitored logistical arteries for crime and terror.

2.2 The Transit Blind Spot

Nigeria currently lacks any unified national system capable of tracking the inter-state movement of persons, goods, or vehicles in real time. This absence has created a dangerous transit blind spot with measurable consequences:

- Over 90% of high-profile kidnappings in 2025 involved vehicles with no digital movement trace.
- More than 60% of smuggled arms entered Nigeria using falsified or unverifiable cargo manifests.
- Passenger identities remain weakly verified, cargo contents are inadequately documented, and movement data is fragmented across operators and agencies.

As a result, intelligence is largely retrospective, investigations begin after crimes occur, and enforcement remains reactive rather than preventive.

2.3 Transportation Anonymity

At the core of Nigeria's insecurity is transport anonymity—the ability of malicious actors to move long distances undetected within a vast, paper-based transport ecosystem.

- **Intelligence Blind Spots:** Security agencies routinely operate without pre-emptive intelligence on the movement of persons of interest. The ambush and kidnapping of Brigadier General Uba starkly illustrated the catastrophic consequences of this intelligence gap, where adversary movement went unseen until after the attack.
- **Operational Deficiencies:** Security forces are overstretched and lack modern technological tools for surveillance, coordination, and planning. In some critical

operations, reliance on unsecured commercial communication networks has further compromised mission effectiveness.

- **The Adversary's Advantage:** Terrorist, bandit, and kidnapping networks deliberately exploit the anonymity of buses, motorcycles, trucks, and informal transport corridors to:
 - Relocate fighters undetected
 - Move victims across state lines
 - Transport arms and logistics
 - Preserve criminal supply chains even when individual operatives are arrested

2.4 Failure of Paper-Based and Siloed Transport Systems

Nigeria's current interstate travel and logistics ecosystem is dominated by analog processes and institutional silos that actively undermine national security.

Key systemic failures include:

- Relocate fighters undetected
- Move victims across state lines
- Transport arms and logistics
- Preserve criminal supply chains even when individual operatives are arrested

A modern security state cannot depend on analog records to secure a nation of over 200 million people.

- **Route Deviation Detection:**

- A freight vehicle deviates into a high-risk forest corridor. The Geofence Monitor triggers an automated alert. Relevant agencies are notified with live location data.

- **Corridor Breach Monitoring:**

- A passenger vehicle enters a known high-threat transit zone. Risk score increases dynamically. Field units receive location-specific alerts.

- **Coordinated Multi-Agency Response:**

- Police, DSS, and civil defence access the same dashboard. Incident data is shared without inter-agency delay. Response units deploy based on real-time verified information.

Response speed increases because intelligence is synchronised at source.

DESIGNATION AND IMPLEMENTATION OF THE NATIONWIDE TRANSIT E-MANIFEST SYSTEM (N-TEMS) AS NATIONAL SECURITY INFRASTRUCTURE

By the President of the Federal Republic of Nigeria

Preamble

WHEREAS the Government of the Federal Republic of Nigeria recognizes the urgent need for real-time accountability and intelligence over passenger and cargo movement across all domestic transport modes to safeguard national security;

AND WHEREAS criminal networks, insurgents, and smugglers exploit gaps in current paper-based and siloed manifest systems;

AND WHEREAS the Nationwide Transit E-Manifest System (N-TEMS) represents a transformative, technologically advanced, and immediately actionable national security infrastructure;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, [President's Full Name and Qualifications] , President of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, by the powers vested in me, hereby issue this Executive Order:

1. Designation

1.1 The Nationwide Transit E-Manifest System (N-TEMS) is hereby designated a National Security Infrastructure Project of strategic importance.

1.2 Your Office shall serve as the coordinating authority.

2. Mandates

- 2.1 All operators of interstate and international commercial transport—including road, rail, air, and maritime—are required to register with N-TEMS via the web portal or USSD system.
- 2.2 All passenger and cargo manifests must be submitted digitally and linked to the National Identity Number (NIN), driver's license, and SIM registration.
- 2.3 QR code verification will be deployed at all major checkpoints.
- 2.4 Full integration with existing government databases (NIMC, NCS, Immigration, FRSC) is mandatory.

3. Governance and Oversight

- 3.1 A High-Level N-TEMS Steering Committee shall be constituted under the NSA to oversee phased implementation.
- 3.2 Security and regulatory agencies (NPF, DSS, NSCDC, NCS, FRSC, Ports & Aviation Authorities) shall have tiered, role-based access to the platform.
- 3.3 An Independent Oversight Body shall monitor compliance, audit usage, and safeguard data privacy.

4. Implementation Roadmap

- **Phase I - Pilot (0-90 Days):** High-risk corridor deployment, initial agency integration, QR verification at 100 key checkpoints.
- **Phase II - Scale-Up (90-365 Days):** Nationwide integration, GPS/IoT on heavy vehicles, geofence red-zone alerts, citizen reporting interface.
- **Phase III - Optimization (12-24 Months):** AI predictive analytics, blockchain audit trails, ECOWAS interoperability.

5. Enforcement & Compliance

- 5.1 Operators failing to comply shall be subject to penalties as prescribed in enabling legislation.
- 5.2 Non-compliant vehicles shall be denied movement until registration and manifest submission are completed.
- 5.3 Agencies shall coordinate to freeze assets and enforce sanctions on flagged operators where appropriate.

6. Funding

Implementation shall be financed through phased releases from the Security Vote, complemented by development partners and public-private partnerships.

7. Effectivity

This Order shall take effect immediately upon signature and remain in force until further notice.
